



Rehabilitation work done in various locations in the Du Bordeaux Street area, including:

- Building ditches, bioswales and a retention basin
- Rebuilding the foundation and repaving the surface

These operations will help improve the drainage system in the area.



Did you know that bioswales are shallow ditches located on the side of the road? Under the vegetated surface of each bioswale is a series of layers to promote drainage and filtration, the goal of which is to control the quality and flow of the water discharged into Dog River (Rivière aux Chiens).

Bicycle path linking Roland-Durand and René-A.-Robert Boulevards

Development of a path for cyclists and pedestrians linking Roland-Durand Boulevard in Rosemère and René-A.-Robert Boulevard in Sainte-Thérèse, including:

- Upgrading the bicycle path
- Relocating existing road signage
- Painting the road markings

This project will improve the connection between existing cycling and pedestrian facilities, enhance the existing infrastructure and help foster healthier lifestyles in the community.
