It's an immersive clue-solving adventure, combining elements of a car rally, a treasure hunt and a walking tour. It's a fun activity to do as a family or a group of friends - and a great opportunity to get out, get moving and get to know your community in a whole new light.

Safety


This is not a race!

Safety first! Be VERY CAREFUL in all areas where CARS are present. Never put yourself in harm's way. Exercise caution AT ALL TIMES. You can walk freely around all public grounds (parks, churches, museums, retail establishments, parking lots, etc.). Note: **None of the clues require you to go inside** any building.

If a change in direction is called for, it will be indicated on your question sheet. Be sure to follow these instructions exactly. Once your team has found an answer, move on to the next question. **DO NOT backtrack.** You will complete your quest by moving forward, not backward (unless otherwise indicated in the instructions).

Where can you find what you're looking for? That's what the game is all about! Be mindful of your surroundings, whether close up or far away. There may be things written in small print on a sign, a monument or a building. **Be observant and read each question carefully. Every word can be a clue! To claim your points, you need to have actually seen the answer.**











The answer can be anywhere you can see with your eyes.

Multiple-choice questions: These are not as easy as you might think! Circle the answer you think is right on the sheet. If there is no choice provided, write out your answer in full. 

Work together as a team!

- Stay together at all times so you can make it to the finish line as a group.

Did you know that...?

Between 1883 and 1887, architect Charles-Frontenac de Bouthillier (1844-1927) drew up the plans for a vast estate, which he then had built on his newly acquired plot of land in Rosemère. The plans included a stone house that was already on site. His goal was to replicate the estate owned by his family in the Normandy region of France.

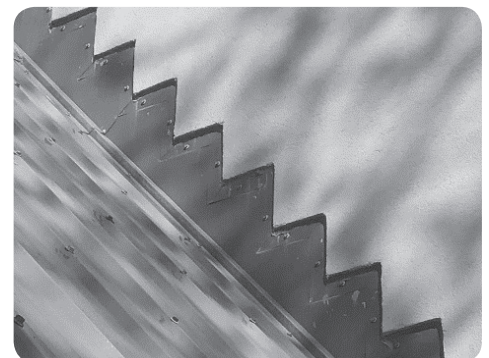

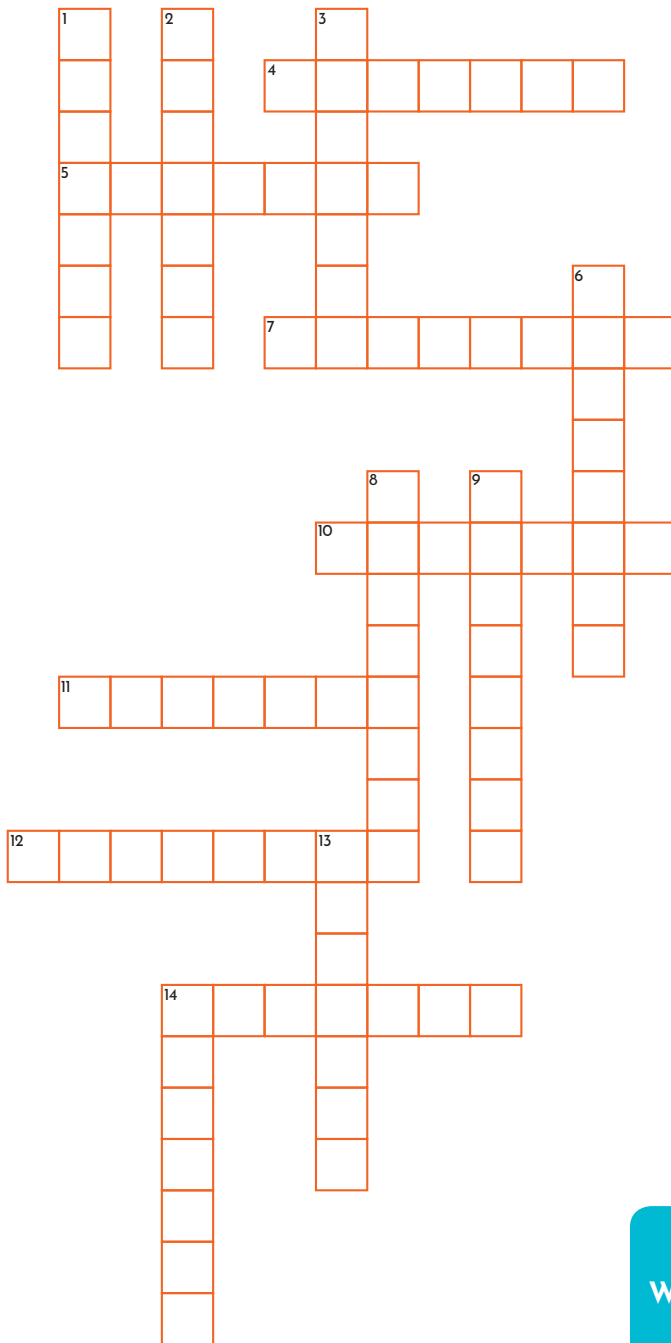
With more than 100 species of feathered friends in the marsh, this trail is a birdwatcher's paradise!
