BULK COMPOST AVAILABLE AT THE ECOCENTRE MAY 14 TO JUNE 9

The compost distribution operation is now done **in bulk** to make the process even more environmentally friendly. Residents are welcome to pick up their allotted amount of compost at the Ecocentre **during regular operating hours**.

Important details:

- **No advance registration.** Residents are entitled to the equivalent of 80 litres of compost, or approximately one wheelbarrow load, per household.
- Shovels are provided, but residents must bring their **own containers**.
- **Fragmented ramial wood** is also available at the Ecocentre.
